Kwamalasamutu : Kwamalasamutu is situated in the south of Suriname, not far from the Brazilian border. The indigenous Trio's are shy but friendly. They live from hunting, fishing and slash and burn agriculture. The village consists of more than 9 different indigenous communities, who live in peace with each other under granman (chief) Asongo Alalaparoe. The Iwaana Saamu Rainforest lodge is beautifully situated on a 20 minutes boottrip away from the village of Kwamalasamutu. Nearby the lodge the caves of Werepai are situated with its impressive 350 petroglyphs.

Brownsberg Nature Park : The Brownsberg nature park is situated 112 km south of Paramaribo and covers 12,000 hectares. The Mazaroni plateau is situated at 500 m with a unique view of the mountain range and the van Blommenstein reservoir. The view of the mountain range with its imposing dense foliage looks just like a picture with a multitude of green shades.

Raleighvallen : By the upper Coppename river, one of the last big, uninhabited and unspoiled rivers on earth, lies 1,6 million hectares of nature reserve with the status of National Park. In this reserve all eight kinds of Surinamese apes are living. The South-American spider monkey is frequently seen during the trip to the Voltzberg. For several years now there is a international scientific research on this particular ape species.

Danpaati River Lodge : Danpaati means " island by the village Dan" and is located in the upper Suriname river. The tourist resort Danpaati was started as part of a health care project in the interior of Suriname. This project is financed by Dutch health insurance companies. When this funding stops the locale community has to able to continue this project on its own. For that purpose and with the cooperation of local Saramaccan village communities, some micro-economic activities are started, such as eco-tourism. The proceeds go to the health care project.

Anaula Nature Resort : The Anaula Nature Resort is Suriname's latest resort and is situated in Upper-Suriname, at an approximate 4.5 hours drive and a one-hour boat trip from Paramaribo, but the resort is also reachable by airplane. An inland flight from Paramaribo to the nearest airstrip Ladoani, takes about 45 minutes. Upper-Suriname is known for its unique Maroon culture and its wonderful Amazon rainforest

Kabalebo Nature Resort : In the mid-west region of Suriname, in the middle of our exceptionally pristine and uninhabited Amazon rainforest, you will find Suriname's latest most exclusive nature- accommodation: Kabalebo Nature Resort. It is a true paradise for nature lovers and is completely uninhabited, which is the reason for its remarkable biodiversity. This part of Suriname is home to many wild animals such as deer, pingo and pakira (wild boar), capybara, tapirs and wild cats such as jaguars and puma.

Galibi : Galibi is a nature reserve, which occupies 4000 hectares. It is situated at the Atlantic Ocean, at the mouth of the Marowijne river in the north east of Suriname. It's charm lays in the mix of unspoiled nature of the beach and the Carib Indian culture that can be found in the villages Christiaankondre and Langamankondre. In the estuary of the Marowijne river is situated the second biggest nesting ground of the world of the giant turtles. It is unbelievable that these very strong prehistoric animals are so vulnerable during their nesting. The nesting season is from March till August.

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
